- Opposition against Jesus' followers grew, which led to the arrest and trial of Stephen. While Stephen defended the gospel and his accusers stoned him to death, he spoke these words, *"Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do"* (Acts 7:60).
- Stephen's stoning incited widespread persecution against the Jewish Christian church. The persecuted ones grew bolder and preached the gospel everywhere they went. Philip played a vital role in the expansion of God's Kingdom.
- Saul, who ruthlessly ravaged and persecuted followers of Jesus, became God's greatest preacher and advocate after he encountered the living Christ on the Road to Damascus.
- God used Peter to turn the beliefs of the Jewish Christian church upside down to ensure that the church knew the gospel was not just for Jews but that Jesus came to seek and save all of God's people, Jews and gentiles alike.
- Philip and Peter's faithful work exploded into a missionary era that formed the church at Antioch. This multi-ethnic church became a mighty tool in equipping and sending out missionaries, like Paul and Barnabas, who brought multitudes upon multitudes of people to Jesus.
