Week 8

- Paul, who wrote the majority of the New Testament, reminds us that the words we read in the New Testament are the inspired words of God.
- Paul, Silas and Timothy set out on their second missionary journey. Paul preached unpopular, powerful and influential messages to the leaders and thinkers in Athens, including the truth that God sent Jesus to judge the world in righteousness and proved this by raising him from the dead.
- Paul set out on his third missionary journey. The gentiles opposed him because the gospel message threatened their economy.
- After several trials, initiated by Jews who were threatened by the message of the gospel, Paul ended up in Rome, where he ministered to the people of Rome as well as the Roman government. Paul spent the last half of his life preaching the good news and lost his life for the sake of saving others.
- Jesus opened the heavens to the apostle John to tell him — but even more to show him — that one day He would return in all His glory as the final victor in the battle against evil. John closed Revelation with this thrilling promise of hope from Jesus, "*I am coming soon*" (Revelation 22:20).
